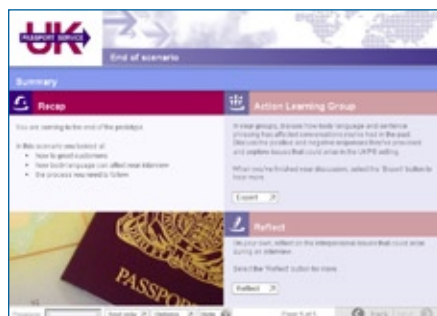
British Museum: World's Timelines

This allows people to explore the artefacts via geography and chronology to enable users to compare and contrast the cultures, stories and artefacts at any specific point in time.
